Nile Green is Professor of History at UCLA and Director of the UCLA Program on Central Asia. He is the author of six monographs, including *Bombay Islam: The Religious Economy of the West Indian Ocean*, which won the Middle East Studies Association's Albert Hourani award and the Association for Asian Studies' Ananda K. Coomaraswamy award. His newest book is *Terrains of Exchange: Religious Economies of Global Islam*. He has travelled and researched among Muslim communities in around twenty countries, from India, Pakistan, Afghanistan and Iran to Morocco, Syria, Yemen, Japan, China and most recently Myanmar. His work brings Islamic history into conversation with global history.
