Raghu Karnad is an author and journalist, and a recipient of a 2019 Windham-Campbell Prize from Yale University. His book, *Farthest Field: An Indian Story of the Second World War*, received the Sahitya Akademi Yuva Puraskar in 2016 and was shortlisted for the PEN Hessel-Tiltman History Prize. He is chief of bureau at theWire.in, a news website he helped to found in 2015. His reporting and essays have been published in the *Guardian*, *Granta*, *n+1*, *the New York Times* and online at the *New Yorker* and *the Atlantic*, and have won several international prizes.
