UCLA School of Law will be hosting two on-campus <u>information sessions</u> on **October 13th** and **November 8th** from **5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.** They will discuss the law school application process, have a Q&A period and offer an optional tour of the law school following the presentation. Speaking of UCLA, the UCLA Law Fellows Program is designed to encourage and prepare high-potential undergraduate and graduate students for a career in law, increase the diversity of the law school pool, and demystify the law school experience. The program includes a series of Saturday Academies which are held at the Law School starting in January of 2017. These Academies offer professionallevel instruction by law faculty in which Law Fellows are exposed to cases and a variety of other materials used in law school. In addition to the academic enrichment component, each Fellow is assigned a law student mentor with whom they will interact throughout the year. Informative seminars and panel discussions, designed to demystify the law school experience, are led by staff, alumni and other members of the legal community. Each Fellow who successfully completes the program receives a scholarship for an LSAT preparation course. The initial deadline to apply is October 21, 2015, but applicants are encouraged to submit their applications as early as possible to ensure maximum consideration.
