Miguel Hernández (1910-42) fought for the Republicans during the Spanish civil war, was incarcerated by Nationalist forces, & condemned to death by Franco for being “a soldier and poet.” He eventually succumbed to tuberculosis at age 32. Renowned for his passionate ability to capture the pain & heightened emotion of Spain’s civil war, Hernández will be discussed by Dr. Cahill as a committed artist in this public lecture on poetry, war, & ethics.
