HOW TO APPLY:

- 1. Visit <u>Cal State Apply</u> and apply by June 1st for starting in the Fall semester or by November 1st to start in the Spring. International students should complete the application at <u>Cal State Apply for International Students</u> usually a month earlier (see <u>this webpage</u> for International Students dates and deadlines; for more information visit the <u>Center for International Education</u>).
- 2. Upload or request the following documents:
 - a. This Application Form.
 - **b. Essay.** Ideally, a corrected essay from one of your upper-level Spanish courses. It should have professor's comments and a grade on it. If you do not have a B.A. or minor in Spanish or such a paper, you need to submit a 3 to 10-page essay related to a topic relevant to the M.A. program courses upon consultation with the Graduate Advisor.
 - c. Statement of Purpose. A short (2-3 page) Statement of Purpose in English or Spanish explaining your personal/professional goals and history in a way that makes clear why getting an M.A. in Spanish will help you meet those goals.
 - d. Transcripts. Transcripts must be official, but if you graduated from CSULB, unofficial transcripts will suffice.
 - **e.** Letters of recommendation. Two letters of recommendation to be uploaded directly by the recommender on Cal State Apply. The letters must attest to the candidate's academic performance and ability to succeed in a graduate program, ideally with good evidence.
- 3. Application deadlines: June 1st for Fall admission; November 1st for Spring.
- 4. When will I be notified? The Graduate Admissions Committee will notify you via email ~ 3 weeks after deadline.
- 5. **What should I do if I am admitted?** Follow instructions on the memo you receive from the advisor; familiarize yourself with the program by visiting the website; and <u>attend our mandatory orientation</u>.
- 6. What classes should I take my first semester? We recommend taking no more than two classes and keep a balance of classes related to the three areas (Linguistics, Latin American studies, Peninsular/Spanish studies). For those interested in being a Teaching Assistant in future semesters, RGR601 is required (offered in the Fall). You should also consider starting the requirement of a second language. You can take the first 3 semesters of that language pass/fail.
