Anand A. Yang, a Professor of International Studies and History, is currently the Chair of the History Department and was formerly the Director of the Henry M. Jackson School of International Studies, University of Washington, Seattle. He is the author of books on *The Limited Raj: Agrarian Relations in Colonial India* and *Bazaar India: Peasants, Traders, Markets and the Colonial State*, and the editor of volumes on *Crime and Criminality in British India* and *Interactions: Transregional Perspectives on World History*. His forthcoming books are on *Empire of Convicts* and *Thirteen Months in China*. Anand was born in Shantiniketan and grew up in New Delhi, a city that he still considers his hometown.
