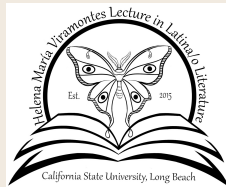

Javier Zamora was born in La Herradura, El Salvador in 1990.

When he was a year old, his father fled El Salvador due to the US-funded Salvadoran Civil War (1980-1992). His mother followed her husband's footsteps in 1995 when Javier was about to turn five. Zamora was left in the care of his grandparents who helped raise him until he migrated to the US when he was nine.

Zamora's first poetry collection, *Unaccompanied*, (Copper Canyon Press, September 2017), explores some of these themes.
